Congratulations! You have a responsible traveller in you.


Fortunately, we are more aware of the impact we have on the destinations we travel to.


### Think of your footprint on the destination

Think carefully about the destination and the impact that it generates. Will it be overcrowded? Is there overtourism? If you avoid the high seasons, you will enjoy your holidays more.

Responsible tourism can help with the first goal of the 2030 Agenda: End Poverty, as it contributes to economic growth and local development by bringing economic spending to the destination.

#### Avoid multinationals

Shop locally, buy your gifts in artisan shops, eat in local restaurants with traditional cuisine... you will be surprised!

02

#### Pay your ticket

Do not skimp on entrance fees to monuments, natural parks, guided tours, etc. A good experience or service requires maintenance and upkeep. Remember the question "Am I paying a fair price for the service I am getting?"

Do not haggle either unless it is an established custom in the country.

03

#### Say yes to tips

Leave a tip appropriate to the cost of living in the place you are visiting. It is not compulsory, but in many countries it is the reward for good service not valued in their salaries.



It contributes to the improvement of **Zero Hunger**, the health and wellbeing of the society that you are visiting and to the provision of quality education.

#### Support small businesses

Do your shopping in small shops. Buy local products that favour agriculture, organic livestock... but when buying a souvenir, NEVER buy animal products or local flora and fauna. If there is no demand, there will be no supply and with it, fauna or flora in danger of extinction.

02

#### No to handouts

Avoid giving money to socially excluded people or children, even if they are insistent; sometimes this is done with the best of intentions, but the money is usually not for them, but for the organisation that controls them.

You can help them through destination development projects or schools that can guarantee them an education. At Green Travel Spain we work with NGOs that you can collaborate with on your big trips, either directly or indirectly.

03

#### Do not waste food

Supporting good nutrition for all and above all, fighting food waste. "Extreme hunger and malnutrition remain a huge obstacle to sustainable development and constitute a trap from which it is not easy to escape". (United Nations. Zero hunger: why it matters).

#### Respect human rights

Do not contribute and report sex tourism. It is a crime both in the destination you visit and in your own country. Spanish law also prosecutes crimes committed by Spaniards outside the national territory.

### Be careful with the activities you hire

Avoid hiring activities that use local people as tourist attractions.

03

#### Be careful with photos

Be careful what or whom you photograph - in some cultures it may be considered an attack on their culture or religion. Ask permission and interact with them.

#### Nature goes first

In nature parks, respect the paths, the signs and the peace of the animals, also for your own safety. Walk without raising your voice.

There are guidelines for behaviour in the wild, perhaps a look at some of them might help you.

02

#### Keep the place clean

Respect the cleanliness of the places you visit. Do not leave litter, plastics, cans, bags, etc. Make use of the litter bins and, if there are none, keep your waste until you find one.

If you see waste along the way, picking it up will have a positive impact on the place, and Pachamama will thank you for it!

03

#### Souvenirs are in shops

Do not subtract elements from the landscape. Leave everything as you found it.

#### Denounce animal abuse

Avoid hiring activities that use animals, as they are usually wild animals that are abused, neglected, or mistreated. It is not uncommon to find wild animals domesticated for the entertainment of tourists; but as with animal souvenirs, if there is no longer a demand, there will be no supply.

Find out about the company and the activity you are hiring and what kind of activity they do. If you see signs of mistreatment or neglect, report it. Social networks can be a good way to do this.

#### 05

### Protect yourself and the sea

Buy environmentally friendly sun creams instead of protective oils, which are more harmful to the sea. The oily film that remains around you when you bathe with "non-environmentally friendly" sunscreen is toxic to marine phytoplankton, crustaceans, algae and consequently to fish.

#### Use public transport

Whenever you can, use public transport, cycle or walk. Take advantage of this and get to know the local people in a very different way, and you will get further without making a big effort and at the same time, you will contribute to reducing pollution.

02

### Consume resources responsibly

Take showers instead of baths, reuse towels, do not ask for change, turn off the lights when you go out and do not leave the air conditioning or heating on or the windows open. The trick is to think about whether you would do it at home.

03

#### Do not stop recycling

Taking care of the environment can go with you on holiday. You will surely find recycling bins in the destinations you visit where you can deposit the solid waste you produce during your stay.

#### Refill your bottle

Carrying a stainless steel bottle with you will allow you to refill it as many times as you need during the trip, whenever possible.

05

#### Avoid plastic

Say no to plastic bags. You can carry a reusable one with you. They don't take up space and you'll avoid the dreaded single-use plastics.

Avoid buying over-packaged products. If you cannot, you can always check the type of packaging to make sure it is reusable or recyclable.

# WHAT IS THE CARBON FOOTPRINT?

THE FOOTPRINTS OF YOUR JOURNEY THROUGH THE WORLD CAN BE GREEN

It turns out that the activities produced by human beings when manufacturing a product or, in this case, carrying out their daily and leisure activities, leave a footprint on the planet made up of greenhouse gases expressed in tonnes of CO2 emitted. These gases, mostly from the burning of fossil fuels, are the ones that accumulate in the atmosphere and cause the famous global warming or the holes in the ozone layer. This footprint is increased during travel, because of the trips and changes in routines, which is why it is so important to reduce it as much as possible or, in this case, to compensate for it.

This consists of calculating CO2 emissions and allocating the economic amount proportional to the tons generated to reforest forests or to energy efficiency projects, for example. Projects verified by Voluntary Carbon Market standards that guarantee that the carbon credits generated are real and measurable (Gold Standard, Verified Carbon Standard, Plan Vivo, ISO 14064:2, etc.).

At Green Travel Spain, in collaboration with the ECODES project, which proposes mixed offsets (part in Spain and part in developing countries), we offset the carbon footprint of your trips whenever you wish. We manage the calculation and compensation without obligation. Remember that you have the power of choice.

Together we can make our planet a better place and the practice of tourism a sustainable activity. Remember that if there is demand, there will be supply.
